The Veterans Treatment Court serves the needs of court-involved veterans who may benefit from alternatives to incarceration due to the physical and mental effects of their military experiences. The court sits weekly with a dedicated judge. Defendants are veterans who plead guilty to a criminal charge and enter the court voluntarily. Instead of being sentenced to jail time, they will enter an 18-month supervised probation period with regular drug and alcohol testing. Veterans will participate in the treatment such as detoxification for substance abuse problems or mental health treatment and will be matched with a veteran mentor. If they are homeless, they will get help finding housing.



Drug Diversion and Treatment Program



Office of Northwestern District Attorney David Sullivan Contact: Program Director Dan Carey: 413-586-9225 A voluntary program for non-violent offenders with substance abuse issues up to the age of 45, charged with certain drug-related offenses. Eligible candidates have the opportunity to receive comprehensive substance abuse treatment services in lieu of prosecution through the traditional court process.

Completing the diversion program requires full participation in an individualized treatment plan with case management for at least 6 months. Clinical evaluations and treatment plans are administered by clinicians from Clinical & Support Options and Center for Human Development and include a range of inpatient and outpatient services and support designed to help participants become drug-free, functioning members of society.

Persons identified by the District Attorney's Office will:

- Receive a thorough clinical evaluation
- Participate in intensive treatment;
- Be subject to strong case management, including drug screening when applicable;
- Be offered a recovery coach to assist with long-term recovery and sobriety.



Addiction is an illness that can strike anyone from any income bracket, education level or professional status. It's not a symptom of poor upbringing or a failure of willpower. Law enforcement sees a correlation between people who struggle with substance use disorder and those who engage in criminal behavior. It's essential that we eliminate stigma against people dealing with addiction so they are able to reach out for the help they need.

We acknowledge that punishment is not the appropriate response to a person with a substance use disorder. Rather we need compassionate treatment options and communities that support people in recovery. And it's also true that we can't treat our way out of our addiction problem. This is why prevention initiatives and public education are crucial. If we want people to live healthy lives unburdened by the disease of addiction, we must work with families and schools to support young people in delaying first use of substances to protect their developing brains.

This is the second printing of this resource guide. Services that support health and wellbeing when it comes to substance use disorders are expanding in our communities. You'll note that included in this guide are prevention, treatment and recovery services as well as other support services. We need them all!
