

NORTHWESTERN DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE CONVICTION INTEGRITY COMMITTEE APPLICATION FOR REVIEW OF A CRIMINAL CONVICTION

The Conviction Integrity Committee (CIC) of the Northwestern District Attorney's Office reviews claims of actual innocence or wrongful conviction. This form is the first step in the review process. It may be completed by someone other than the defendant in the case for which the review is sought, but it must be signed and initialed by the defendant. Please complete the form as fully as possible. If you do not know the answer, you may indicate that in the space provided. If you have documents that support your claims, please send copies of them. **Do not send original documents or your only copy of any documents.**

The CIC will confirm receipt of your application within thirty (30) days.

Where "applicant," "you," or "your" is indicated, the requested information needs to be provided about the person seeking to have their case reviewed by our office. If the person completing this application is not the applicant, please indicate that and complete the section.

The Conviction Integrity Committee (CIC) will only accept cases for review where the following apply:

- 1. You must have been convicted of a felony in a court located in Hampshire or Franklin County, Massachusetts.
- 2. You must present a plausible claim of <u>actual innocence</u> (for instance, you did not commit or participate in the crime charged) or have a plausible claim of <u>wrongful</u> conviction due to unfairness.
- **3.** Except in extraordinary circumstances, the direct appeal has become final, and there is no other pending litigation.

Please keep in mind the following: The CIC <u>does not</u> review sentences. Absent extraordinary circumstances, the CIC <u>does not</u> review affirmative defenses, claims, or other information/evidence that was previously considered and litigated before the original finder of fact (jury or judge). The CIC <u>does</u> review affirmative defenses, claims, or other information/evidence that was <u>not</u> previously considered by the original finder of fact (jury or judge).

IMPORTANT: If you are currently represented by an attorney, the CIC will only communicate with your attorney. You should consult your attorney prior to submitting this application because your attorney may want to assist you with the application or submit the application on your behalf.¹

	I understand that acknowledgment of receipt of this application by the Northwestern District Attorney's Office does not mean they accept my case for investigation, and does not mean they accept my claim of innocence and/or wrongful conviction.
	I understand I am providing information about my case to a prosecutor's office.
	I understand my statements in this application can be used against me in court.
	I acknowledge that knowingly providing false information will result in a rejection of my submission to the Conviction Integrity Committee.
