CAR SAFE Protect your child from overheating



In summer heat, cars

 can be among the most
 dangerous places for
 people and pets: In 2
 minutes, the temperature
 can spike over 15 degrees
 and in 30 minutes, by 30
 degrees. After an hour,
 inside a car can be over
 40 degrees hotter than
 outside.

 Actively use prompts that your child is in a car seat: place a purse, lunch or other important items in the back seat

Lock your car and keep keys out of reach of children

- Look before you lock
- Use properly fitting car seats
- Never leave a child alone in a parked car under any circumstances, even if they are asleep or restrained with the windows open
- If a child is missing, first check cars, including the trunk
- Tell your childcare provider to call you if your child is not dropped off at daycare when expected
